Our reading days flourished this year, placing thousands of books into the hands of young readers across Sarasota, Manatee, and Pinellas counties.

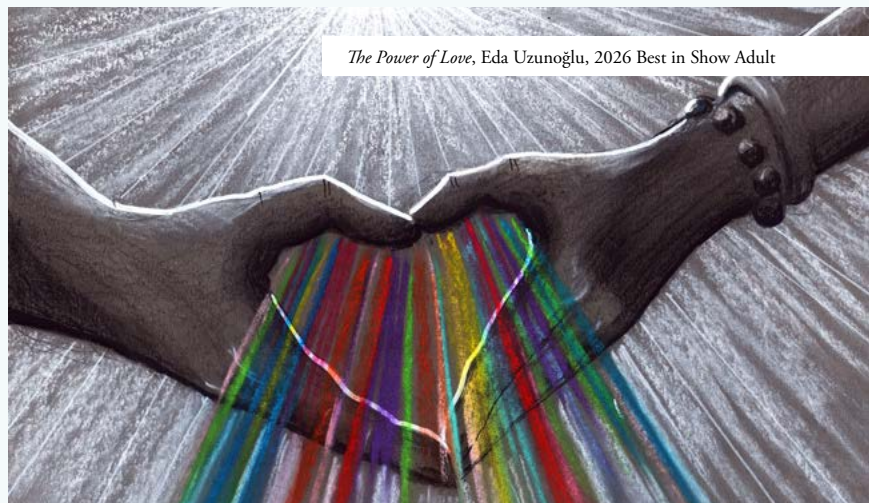

The centerpiece of Embracing Our Differences is a juried, outdoor exhibition featuring 50 billboard-sized images and accompanying quotations created by local, national and international artists, writers, and students reflecting their interpretations of our mission.

The exhibitions welcomed 449,982 visitors this past year, bringing total attendance, since 2004, to more than 5,600,000.

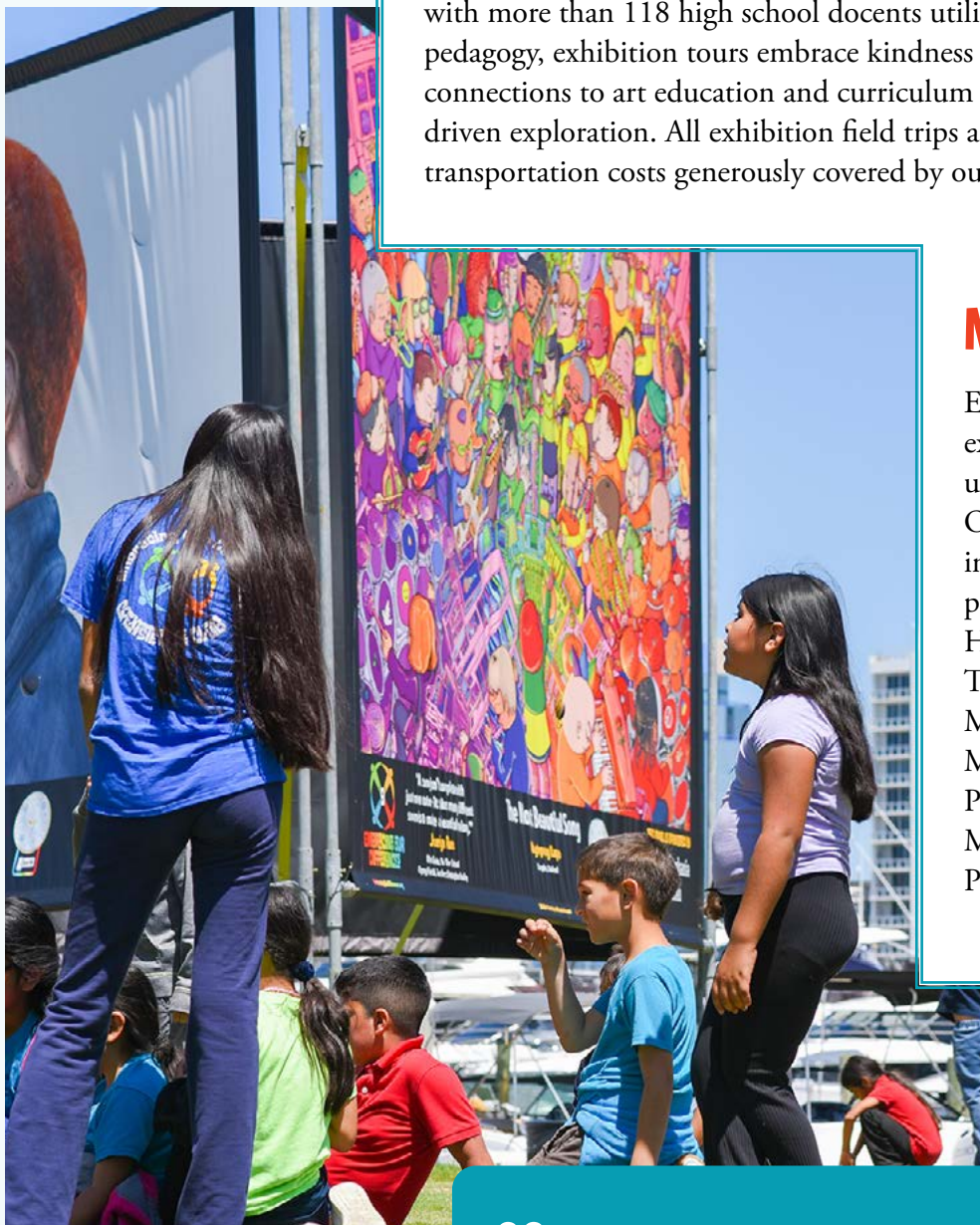

FIELD TRIPS

Tours of our annual exhibitions have become a signature of our education efforts with thousands of students worldwide benefiting from in-person, live-virtual, and on-demand video tours this past school year. Through peer-guided conversations with more than 118 high school docents utilizing Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS) pedagogy, exhibition tours embrace kindness and inclusion while providing connections to art education and curriculum engagement through student-driven exploration. All exhibition field trips are FREE, with in-person field trip transportation costs generously covered by our sponsors and donors.

Educators and students who attend the exhibition are afforded the opportunity, using buses provided by Embracing Our Differences, to participate in inclusive education programming with partner organizations, including Florida Holocaust Museum, Florida Studio Theatre, Marie Selby Botanical Gardens, Mote Marine Laboratory, Sarasota Art Museum, Sarasota Film Festival, Patriot Plaza, The Dali Museum, The Ringling Museum, FloridaRAMA, and Van Wezel Performing Arts Hall.

BUCKET FILLERS READING DAY



Using the concept of an invisible bucket to encourage positive behavior, the Bucket Fillers' book series teaches children how to "fill buckets" through acts of kindness, love, and appreciation for others. Pre-K through third grade educators have the option of selecting an in-person volunteer reader or a pre-recorded webisode, featuring local arts organizations and author Carol McCloud, for their classroom.

EMBRACING OUR DIFFERENCES READING DAY

In partnership with Suncoast Campaign for Grade-Level Reading, Embracing Our Differences Reading Day celebrates literacy through books by diverse authors and illustrators for pre-K through third grade students. These age-appropriate stories focus on themes of inclusion, acceptance, and belonging. Educators select either an in-person volunteer reader or an on-demand video read along, and all classes are provided with on-demand activity videos.

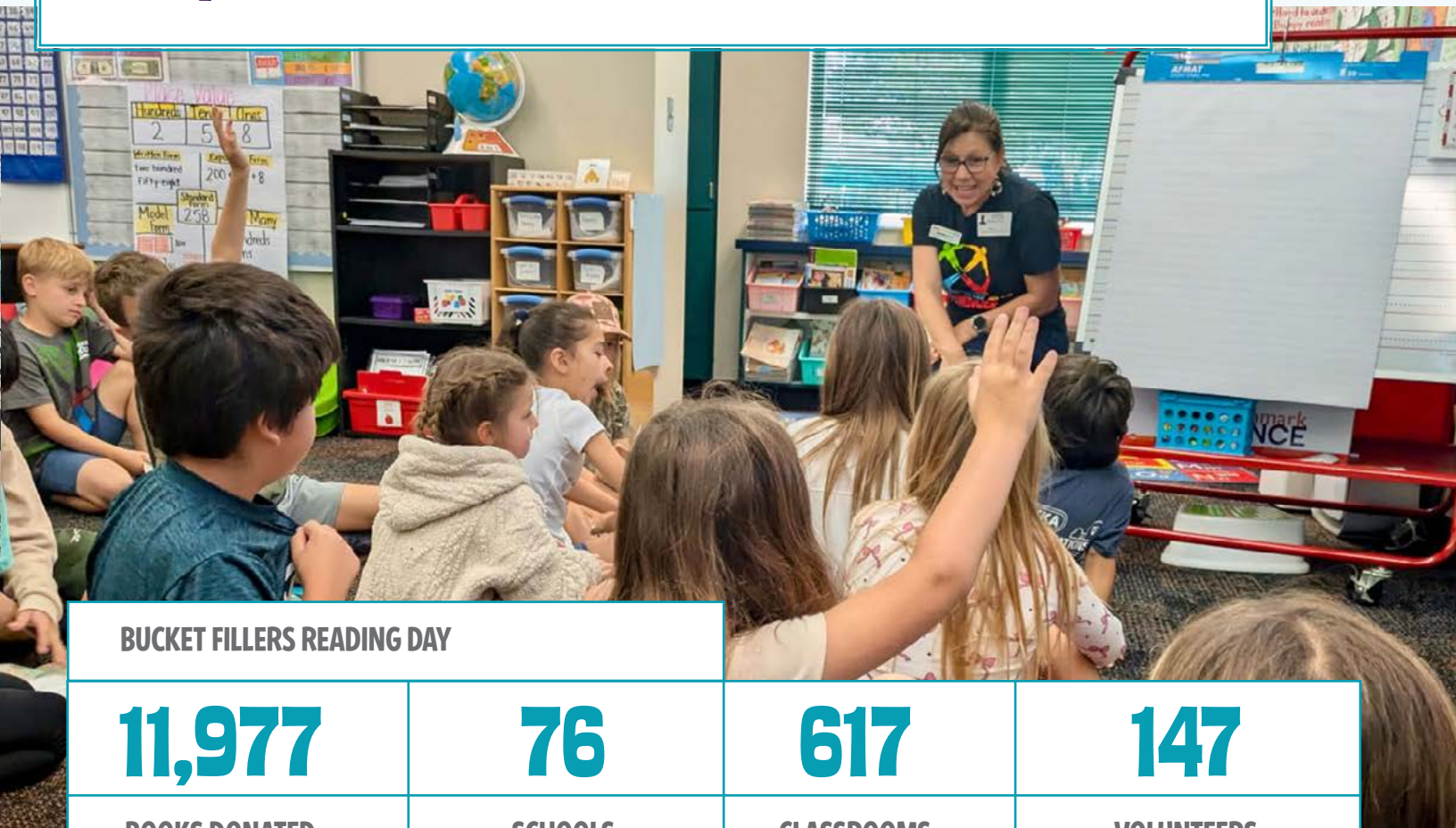

STUDENT DOCENT PROGRAM

Under the guidance of Docent Coordinator, Dena Sturm, high school students serve as guides for thousands of local elementary, middle, and high school students who visit the exhibitions each year. Docents use Visual Thinking Strategies (VTS) to help students analyze and critically think about the artwork and quotations, inspiring them to create their own interpretations of the pieces they discuss.

UNITY DAY

Embracing Our Differences Unity Day initiative promotes empathy, respect, and resiliency amongst students through a multi-part workshop of team-building activities that encourage cooperation and communication while providing opportunities for students to embrace their similarities and respect their differences.

Under the direction of a trained facilitator and school guidance counselors, the Unity Day initiative was held at Pine View School, Riverview, North Port, Suncoast Polytechnical, Imagine North Port, Sarasota, and Venice High Schools. More than 456 students participated in a powerful day of team-building exercises that encourage compassion and empathy while fostering inclusive school environments.

2026 SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

In May 2026, three Coexistence Club graduating seniors were selected to receive \$1,000 renewable Coexistence Club Scholarships in recognition and gratitude for dedicated service and commitment to their school club during their high school years. They join seventeen students who have been awarded this special scholarship.

This award is given in the spirit of the mission of the Embracing Our Differences organization with the hope that the recipient's experiences through service to the club and the organization were profound and impressive and shall inspire them to continue this great work into their future.

WORKSHOPS & LESSON PLANS FOR EDUCATORS AND ADULTS

ART INTENSIVE

The 2025 Art Intensive brought together 53 visual arts teachers for an in-person experience at the Sarasota Art Museum. Featuring sessions from local artists and scholars, participants engaged in powerful presentations and interactive lessons geared toward inspiring and reinvigorating teaching practices. Collectively, this year's participants are responsible for more than 13,500 students in Charlotte, Hillsborough, Manatee, Pinellas, and Sarasota counties.

Abstract concepts, like kindness and inclusion, are best delivered to students through interactive participation. Prepared under the supervision of curriculum development specialists from the Manatee and Sarasota County school districts, the age-appropriate lesson plans identify the relevant curriculum standards, educational objectives, instructional strategies, and assessment guidelines.

INCLUSION AND BELONGING ADULT SEMINARS

EOD's vision of a world that embraces and respects differences and actively rejects hatred and prejudice extends beyond pre-K through 12th grade student communities. EOD has provided interactive training sessions for Northwestern Mutual St. Louis, Siemens Mobility, All Star Children's Foundation, Florida Art Education Association, and Florida Alliance for Arts Education, in addition to Sarasota County Schools and School District of Manatee County educators, guidance counselors, and administrators.

Thousands of students in our community and around the world spend time creating art and quotations for submission to our annual exhibition. Students have the opportunity to express themselves creatively while interpreting their viewpoints on abstract themes. By engaging in these skills, students develop an enhanced sense of self-esteem, increased social skills, and experience new and different perspectives from their peers.



EDUCATION AMBASSADOR PROGRAM

At the heart of Embracing Our Differences is a belief that inclusive learning environments create stronger, kinder, and more connected communities. The Education Ambassador Program is a year-long, district-supported leadership initiative designed to equip and empower Manatee and Sarasota County educators, administrators, and school-based professionals to become catalysts for inclusion, kindness, and respect in their schools.

The 24 members of the Education Ambassador Program 2025-2026 cohort represent 22 schools plus district administrators and 7,497 students from Manatee and Sarasota counties.

While completing eleven hours of professional development workshops, educators work with students on projects that highlight EOD's core values of inclusion, kindness, and respect.
